Trek Malawi

The bus carefully navigates down a dusty road, riddled with potholes. Makeshift stores, open fires, running children, mud houses all contribute to a sensory overload.

This is Lunzu, a small town outside Blantyre, Malawi known for its extreme poverty and prostitution. Over time, the town morphed around the one asphalt road connecting northern Malawi to the south, like a spine down the center of the country.

Lunzu, a popular rest stop for truck drivers, feeds a sex industry dependent on impoverished girls desperate to earn a few dollars.

As our bus inches closer to a large metal gate, we hear something. Singing! Not a dirge or lament, reflecting the hopelessness we have sensed on our winding drive to our entrance. But instead... joy. Celebration. Laughter.

Behind the gate, behind the 6-foot-high brick wall, our group is greeted by a hundred or so children led by a handful of energetic local teens. Although we understand little of the local language, we sense that these songs are about God. Children dance and clap. Hope has an address in Lunzu. Young & Empowered Ministries has built a home and ministry here.

Headed by 2 UrbanPromise International Alumni, Dorothy Kamoto and Lucy Nkwinika, these committed women intentionally chose this community.

"This community is notorious throughout Malawi," shared Lucy, "between teen pregnancies, catastrophic drop-out rates, and prostitution, there is a level of hopelessness unparalleled. We felt called to serve here."

So it was for Lucy and Dorothy and the beautiful children of Lunzu that I joined 8 others to bike across Malawi this summer in July.

Our team peddled almost 200 miles over the course of 5 days and raised \$70,000 to support ministries like Young & Empowered and 15 other ministries throughout Malawi and Africa.

In total, we were able to provide summer camp for over 3,000 children. 71,500 meals were served. And 220 teens and young adults were employed to work at the camps.

I would like to think WE made a real difference this summer.

And I personally would like to thank the congregation for you prayers and support. I am also happy to share that I exceeded my goal of raising \$5,000 by \$200.

So thank you Stewartsville Presbyterian Church for your support of me and for making a real difference in the lives of so many children and youth in Africa!
















2023 Mission Trip to Puerto Rico



 - Grace Presbyterian Church, Montclair, NJ: \$500 for Church Rebuild
 (Grace Presbyterian is part of our presbytery and was destroyed by a fire in August.)
 - Techos Pa' Mi Gente, Puerto Rico: \$100
 (Techos was the mission partner our mission trip team worked with in Puerto Rico.)
- Approval was given to host 2 blood drives in 2024 on Sunday, March 17 and Sunday, September 15.
- Approval was given to Henry Choi, who is 13-years-old, to volunteer in the nursery with an adult.
- The Rev. Salvatore Seirmarco will serve as pulpit supply on Sunday, September 17.
